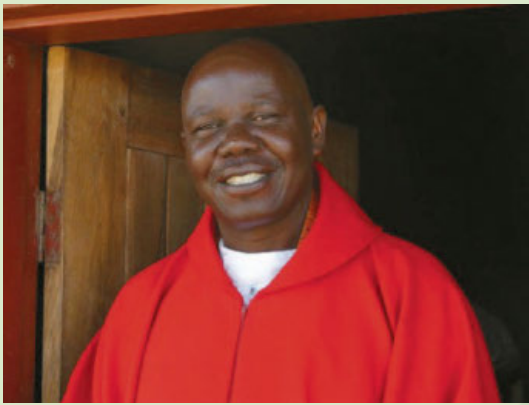
From the Desk of Fr. Jerry

October 13, 2024

Dear Friends,

Several years ago, I received a phone call. The caller identified himself as a priest of Zambia, a landlocked country in Southern Africa. He was studying in a two-year graduate program at Catholic Theological Union in the Hyde Park neighborhood of Chicago. "I want to go back to my country as a priest," he told me. "Would you be my spiritual companion while I am here?"

Fr Wilfred told me later his parents wanted to give him the African name "Bwezani," but the priest who baptized him told them that wasn't the name of a saint. The priest gave him the name Wilfred.



Fr. Wilfred and I met at least once a month for the next two years. One day I joked that I would visit Zambia when he became a Bishop, something I fully expected would happen. Two years later he wasn't yet a Bishop, but a close advisor of one. I decided to make the long journey. During Holy Week and the Triduum in 2014, my eyes were opened to a situation of great need. Upon my return home, a boy scout seeking the rank of Eagle approached me about a service project. The result was a bike drive for Africa.

The first missionaries to Zambia established a parish in the Luangwa River Valley of Eastern Zambia, but they found the conditions harsh and later abandoned their mission. The Catholic people of the area felt abandoned and complained to the bishop. The bishop made a commitment to start new parishes there. That is when Fr. Wilfred became pastor of the new parish called Chikwa where the traditional tribal chief resides.

Priests in poor African dioceses receive no salary or vehicle. Still, they serve parishes covering wide areas that consist of multiple outstations, even up to a dozen or more, and smaller Christian communities. The priest visits all of these by bike, motor scooter, or sturdy vehicle, if he is lucky to have one and if he finds a way to pay for the gas. There are no paved roads. When the majority of folks are subsistence farmers they are unable to provide adequate "vuna," the material support of the priest.

When I retired, I established "Friends of Chikwa Parish NFP" to continue the effort to support Fr. Wilfred's mission and the building of the new Holy Cross Church at Chikwa. Although the response has remained consistently strong, the need remains great.

The video presentation and discussion planned for this coming Tuesday evening at 7:00 PM in O'Gara Center resulted from a "Vision Trip" sponsored by World Vision, Zambia in August. The video gives a "before and after" view of life with and without water and electricity. Please come and see.

The Liturgical Year through the Rosary

Throughout our lives as Catholics, we have many opportunities to learn about Jesus, through our Catholic education, through media, and in conversations with one another. A very personal way to continue to learn about the Life of Christ each day is through prayer, particularly the Rosary. Through the mysteries of the Rosary, each decade tells the story of Jesus, and throughout the week, we are reminded of the many Liturgical Seasons.

The Five Joyful Mysteries are customarily prayed on Mondays, Saturdays, and, during the season of Advent, on Sundays. During this time of prayer, we revisit the hope we experience at Advent and the joy we feel at Christmas, anticipating Our Lord's arrival to save us from sin and death. The third mystery is a meditation on the birth of Our Lord and the love of the Holy Family.

The Five Sorrowful Mysteries are customarily prayed on Tuesdays, Fridays, and, during the season of Lent, on Sundays. In reciting these Mysteries of the Rosary, we are transported to Holy Week. These mysteries prepare us for the Liturgical Season of Lent, and we may have a better understanding of Our Lord's Passion, and thus a better Lenten experience due to our devotion through the Rosary each day.

The Five Glorious Mysteries are customarily prayed on Wednesdays and, outside the seasons of Advent and Lent, on Sundays. As stated by the USCCB, "The Easter Vigil is the 'Mother of All Vigils' and Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church." How beautiful that we have the opportunity to be a part of this season all year round through the Rosary! These mysteries also include Pentecost, the birth of the Church!

The Five Luminous Mysteries are customarily prayed on Thursdays. The Luminous Mysteries are a combination of Ordinary time and the institution of the Eucharist which occurs on Holy Thursday. These Mysteries, as a deacon once expressed, are extra-ordinary and they show us a time in which Jesus performed miracles, particularly the second mystery, the Wedding at Cana, Jesus' first Miracle.

The Liturgical Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Holy Week, and Easter can be a part of your life each and every week through praying the Rosary. This prayer is an excellent way to appreciate Our Lord, His life and His self-sacrifice through the Rosary.

During this month of October, the Eucharistic Revival Team will have a table in the back of the Church with information, books and rosaries. We hope to inspire you on your Walk with One journey when you can perhaps pray for a specific person as your personal intention while reciting the Rosary. Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Today we join with every diocese around the globe to celebrate World Mission Sunday. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH
AWARENESS - SERVICES - PREVENTION

BYSTANDERS INTERVENTION What to do if you witness abuse?

As a friend, colleague or family member, you can make a big difference if you see or know about abuse or violence in a marriage. Only step in when it is safe to do so!

ASK: “Are you okay?” “What do you need from me right now?”

LISTEN: Empower them to make choices. Avoid telling them what to do. Praise them for coping in such a difficult situation.

SAY: Keep calm. Keep it simple. “I saw/heard/notice...and I’m feeling worried about you.”

TELL: Get support from trusted professionals.

STAND BESIDE: Sit next to them and ask “How can I help?” or “Would you like some help?”

GET HELP: Have a support option ready, if they give you permission: 1-800-799 (SAFE) 7233. Secure an online chat: loveisrespect.org. TEXT “loveis” to 22522.

DOCUMENT: Suggest they keep evidence such as photos, dated journal entries screenshots.

CALL 911: If you think that you or someone else may be in danger

DON'T GIVE UP on them as a friend, even if they choose to stay in the relationship.

LOOK AFTER YOURSELF: Pay attention to how you are feeling. Set limits for what you can reasonably do to help.

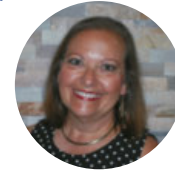

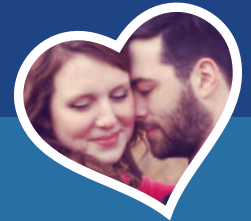
